I bought the car on Labor Day, Sept. 2013. It was totally black with blacked out side markers, black dipped OEM wheels and no accessories.

I have dedicated it to the memory of my only child, my son, Crawford, who died in 2007. Crawford died two weeks before graduating high school and was planning to go to college and major in "Auto Detailing". Black was his favorite color and he loved to accent his own car in chrome.

I have a specialized plate cover: "In memory of my son Crawford" and a personalized Indiana plate "4 Craw4d" with bezel angel wings and halo around plate.

As you know; I got carried away and added almost every exterior and interior accessory (except the chrome trunk latch...which I will buy used when I find one) that they make for the C6 corvette, plus more.

The next round of the 2017 IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship is America's oldest professional sports car endurance race, the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring set for Saturday, March 18. This is a historical event, part of which is run on the former WWII Hendricks Army Air Field, now the Sebring Regional Airport. The air field was used for B-17 flight crew training beginning in 1942.

This year's race marks the 50th anniversary of the first appearance of the famous L88 Corvette. A Sunray DX 1967 L88 Corvette captured the important GT class victory and finished 10th overall with Don Yenko and Dave Morgan sharing the driving. Following a close four-way battle in the closing stages of last months Rolex 24 Hours at Daytona, between a Ford GT, Ferrari 488, Corvette C7.R and Porsche 911 RSR, team manager Ben Johnson says maximizing the Corvette package and eliminating team errors will prove crucial vital for the team's success at Sebring, and beyond. Last year, Tommy Milner took the No. 4 Corvette to its second consecutive class win. Competition will be much more intense this year from Ford, Porsche, Ferrari, and BMW. It may be tough to top the 2016 season for the Corvette team. The No. 4 car won the championship and the No. 3 was third, sandwiching the No. 67 Ford Chip Ganassi Racing Ford GT. "We definitely had a successful 2016," Johnson said. "We had some luck fall our way. But mostly good execution got us where we were."

The Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring takes place March 15-18, 2017. The race will be aired on FS1 from 12:30 to 11:00 p.m. ET, with flag-to-flag coverage on Fox Sports Go starting at 10:30 a.m. ET. The green flag drops at 10:40 a.m.






