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Corvette Indy Meeting at Champp's, March 21, 2016

The meeting was called to order by Wylie Etscheid at 7:30. Wylie asked for additions or corrections to the meeting minutes from the March 7th meeting. A motion was made to accept the minutes as written by Butch DeWitt and was seconded by Shelley Noelle and then passed.

OFFICERS REPORTS

President: Wylie opened the meeting reminding members that the Vettes for Vets event is May 7th and the Veterans Home is planning on a large turnout from our club. Greg Bowron sent an email to members with a list of specific Corvettes that they are going to display at this year's

event. Wylie asked that if your car is one listed on the email to please consider showing your car at this event.

Vice President: Greg Bowron was not present and therefore had no report.

Membership Director: Tammy DeWitt introduced 2 new members who joined at tonight's meeting. Our new members are Jimmie and Donna Driscoll. Our membership total is now 256. Tammy had Eckler's calendars to pass out to anyone who did not receive one in the mail. She also reported that NCCC wants email addresses for all members to send information to us. The emails that will be sent will not be spam and should not be often. If you don't want to receive any emails from NCCC please let Tammy know and she will change your preference setting.

Secretary: Terri Forey reported that there were 68 names on the waivers and if anyone needed to sign please do so before you leave.

Treasurer: Jim Noelle reported income, expenses and balances and provided a hard copy for file.

Governor: Butch DeWitt reported that the next Region Meeting will be April 22nd and 23rd in St. Louis Missouri. Main Event planning is progressing and some specific signup sheets have been created and were circulating at tonight's meeting. The planning committee will create other sheets if necessary. At this time Butch is looking into portable toilets which will be needed since there are no facilities available at the site. He also said we need several long tables and if anyone has a canopy they can bring to help provide shade it would be appreciated. Bloomington Gold planning is in a holding pattern until after the next Region meeting. There are signup sheets circulating tonight to get things started. Tammy mentioned at the last meeting that NCCC is trying to decide on a new national charity to support. The three choices were St. Jude's, Shriners, or Lions Club. Butch asked our club to vote on our preference and he would cast a vote on our behalf. The winner was St. Jude's after a vote taken of those in attendance. Butch also reported that there would be a practice Auto Cross event at Grissom April 2nd and 3rd. No points will be awarded for this event. Butch said that meeting minutes from the Governor's Meeting are available on the Regional website.

Competition Director: Cathy reminded everyone to turn in your point sheets. February sheets are available on the fireplace hearth.

Sergeant of Arms: Shelley Noelle says thanks for buying tickets. She collected \$136.

Parliamentarian: No issues.

Newsletter Editor: Erika Lapham reported that the 'For Sale' section will be returning to the newsletter. Please send information to Erika to have your ad included. Erika said the section is for car related items only.

Merchandise Director: Ross Gullett reported that tonight would be the last meeting to order Main Event T-shirts. Penske Rep: Bob Young reported that the release date of the 2017 Corvette and the order dates for the 2016 Corvettes have been determined however he doesn't have the dates. Please check with your dealer for exact dates. Bob also reported that Penske has a large inventory of cars and if interested check their website.

NCM Rep: Jerry Croy reported that the 'Sink Hole' display is open at the Corvette Museum. He reminded everyone of 'The Bash' at NCM April 24-26. The motor park at the museum is opening 17 acres up for sale and the acreage will be used to build berms to keep the noise level down since this has been an issue to nearby homes. If you buy the acre the land will be donated back to the museum to build the berms on.

Social Director: Greg Bowron was not in attendance but Wylie Etscheid reminded everyone that this Saturday from 11:00 to 3:00 our club will be cooking out at Penske. We will need people to help with the event and if you can't be there for the entire event please stop in and support your fellow club members and Penske. Corvette Indy 4" Window Clings.

Last night one of our club members bought 4 CI Window Clings for his vehicles. He mentioned that the old one had come off his window. Thus, the reason for this being mentioned in the club newsletter. Our 4" Window clings will stick to either side of your vehicle window. They are designed to stick to the inside of your windows. I have one on the inside of my Corvette Windshield and on my Daily Driver Windshield. Both are clearly visible, and totally protected from the elements (wind, rain, etc). They can go on the inside of any window on your vehicle. They might be hard to see if they are applied to heavily tinted windows, but for a normal tinted window, they look great. The Picture below is actually taken of the one on my daily driver. They are very easy to apply, and can go on the inside of your vette or daily driver windshield, back hatch, or any window that doesn't go up or down (yes, if put it on a roll down window they might get ripped off by the weather stripping if you do that). They are very economical at \$4 each. Because they are not decals, but are static clings, they can easily be removed or relocated to any other location or vehicle of your choice. 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Save the C3 Corvette!

Steel Floor Pans were introduced in 1976 Corvette production to counter the excessive heat generated by the new catalytic converterequipped exhaust systems. As the Corvettes were exposed to the elements and experienced rust issues, it was not uncommon to see them end up at a scrap heap or salvage parts marketplace. The good news is, most of these late C3 Corvettes can return safely and happily to the highway with a reasonable investment of time and labor. Mid America Motorworks tells you how.

Original or Replacement?

It's possible to exchange the rusted original Floor Pan sections on your rusted C3 in a manner that will make detection nearly impossible from beneath the car. From the inside, especially as part of an interior restoration, no sign of the work is visible. All nut plates for the seat and seat belt anchor points are provided. Mid America Motorworks has even developed and engineered our replacement floor pans to limit the need for specialized skills and tools.

1976-1982 Steel Floor Pan Installation

- Unbolt and remove seats, sill plates, seat belts, console and park brake trim and carpet and padding/sound deadener.
- On the Driver's side, there will be a wiring harness running along the floor pan. Move this harness out of the way. Duct tape may be used to secure it, so that it will not interfere with installation
- Place the Corvette on a lift or jack stands.
- Some Corvette models have a heat/splash shield on the lower firewall that may need to be removed.
- While the Corvette is raised, examine the underside to locate fuel lines, brake lines, cables, and wiring harnesses. These must be avoided when cutting away the rusted pans.
- Cut the rusted pans out using the die grinder.
- 7. Lay the new pans in place and mark where the upper edges meet the stock pans. You will need to leave at least 1.5" of the original pans below the lip of the new pans to serve as an attachment flange.
- 8. Examine the stock floor pans to see how much metal needs to be replaced. Cut away the rusted area. Leave enough material around the edges and center tunnel to attach the repair panels. The rear of the stock pans must be cut at the point where the floor begins to angle up behind the seat area at the riser. For best overall fit and finish, clean away as much rust build-up, factory tar sealer, and other foreign material as possible from the contact area where the new pans are to be welded or riveted. (See Fig. 1 and Fig. 2)
- 1977 late to 1982 Corvettes On the rusted, stock pans cut out the outer factory seat belt weld nuts and plate located near the door sill plate area. New pans have the necessary nuts in place. (See Fig. 3)

- 10. Note: For Corvettes with seat belt retractors located under the seat, remove the outer side weld nuts found on the new pans. Extra seat belt nuts are provided that must be welded in position, after drilling a hole in the bottom of the new pan depression (under the seat area)
- 11. You may pre-form the forward lip of the new pans, by bending up at a 15-20 degree angle to assist in the initial fit. (See Fig. 4)
- 12. Fit the new pans in place, mark and trim as needed. You may have to fit and trim multiple times to get the right fit. The inner front corner may need to be bent in slightly on some cars. It is easiest to position the inner front corner first, then the outer front corner. Finally, press the rear of the pan into place.
- 13. Tip: Use a hammer and block of wood to form pans into position. Outer lip near sill areas may be peened over or flanged by bending over with a block of wood and hammer. (See Fig. 5 and Fig. 6)







- Secure outer rear corner by drilling a small hole in the new pan and the factory riser panel. Insert and tighten a metal screw there. (See Fig. 7)
- 15. Temporarily position your seat in place and see if it is level. Adjust the rear of the pan, until the seat is level. Then drill holes at the inner rear corner of the pan and secure with screws. Work your way around the perimeter of the new pans, drilling and securing with 2 or 3 screws on each edge.
- 16. Mark the location of rear seat bolts. Drill and use supplied nut plates by holding in place over the bolt holes and marking rivet hole locations on the Floor Pan. Remove plate, drill rivet holes and rivet nut plates on bottom of new pans. (See Fig. 8)
- Now it's time to decide if you wish to weld the pans in place (preferred method) or to seal and use rivets.



Welding in Floor Pans

1. Remove the Floor Pans. Use a wire brush or wheel to clean off the car panels where pan will be welded. Apply weld primer to the outside of pans, where they contact the car. Drill holes in the pan sides and back every 2-3 inches for blind welds for best adhesion. Set the pans in place, resecure with screws and weld. Let cool, then apply caulking or seam sealer around the perimeter to block moisture.

Riveting Floor Pans

- Remove the Floor Pans. Use a wire brush or wheel to clean off the car panels where the pan will be riveted. Apply a heavy coat of sealer, set the pans in place, re-install screws to hold the Floor Pans in the correct position. Drill rivet holes in the sides and the back and rivet in place with rivets every 2-3 inches around perimeter.
- The front lip may be riveted at the holes found in fiberglass. Drill up into the new pan from the underside of the Corvette through these existing holes. Then rivet the front lip in place.
- Smooth out any sealer that extrudes from the overlap area. Apply MWorks Steel Shield or other Rust Preventative Paint to the upper and lower surface of the pans. Let cure for at least 24 hours.
- 4. Install the new Sound Deadener, Carpet and Seat belts. Reinstall seats and firewall heat/splash shield, if removed.

2016 Corvette Stingray - A Review

America's sports car continues into 2016 with a choice of four models—two engines, each available in coupe and convertible bodies. From a base Stingray to a supercar-baiting Z06 convertible, you'll find the Corvette range to offer some of the very best bang for the buck in the industry.

The seventh-generation Vette's styling has gone in a new direction while taking advantage of familiar themes, both inside and out. Sharp lines, crisp angles, and vents aplenty give a definite supercar air to the design that matches the car's performance. It's wide, low, and looks fast even when standing still. Inside, the Stingray's design is much improved over the previous generation of the Corvette, with a refreshing and surprisingly luxurious look. The Z06 adds to the Stingray's exterior and interior design with wider fenders, an array of aerodynamic add-ons, and a performance-themed cabin treatment.

Under the hood of the Chevy Corvette Stingray is the latest performance small-block, a 6.2-liter LT1 V-8 generating 455 horsepower and 460 pound-feet of torque. The Z06 ups the ante with a supercharged LT4 V-8 displacing 6.2 liters and related to the LT1 that's rated at 650 hp and 650 lb-ft of torque. A 7-speed manual is standard with both engines, offering an automatic rev-matching downshift function that was enhanced for 2015. Another addition last year was an all-new, in-house-designed and built 8-speed automatic with steering wheel-mounted paddle shifters.

And the 2016 Corvettes continue to spit out eye-popping performance numbers. The Stingray's 455-hp V-8 offers plenty of push to accelerate the car, hitting 60 mph in just 3.8 seconds with the manual—or 3.7 seconds with the 8-speed automatic. Quarter-mile times are a mere 11.9 seconds with the automatic or 12.0 with the 7-speed manual. Whether tackling the straights or the curves, the Stingray offers ample performance, with surprising grip, nimble reflexes, and a great deald of communication through the seat, pedals, and steering wheel, all of which inspires driver confidence. A Z51 package is available to further enhance the Stingray's performance, with modified aero, lighter wheels, and bigger brakes among its features. In Z06 trim, the manual car can click off 3.2-second 0-60 mph runs, while the automatic is even quicker, clocking in at an astounding 2.95 seconds.

The 'Vette's Performance Traction Management system keeps the car balanced and easy to control even near the limit with Track mode (and the Race sub-mode) engaged. The Stingray can be a bit harder to control with all of the aids off, though it still exhibits remarkable poise and balance. In fact, the Corvette Stingray can realistically run with sports cars costing twice its price.

The interior of the 2016 Corvette carries forward the substantial upgrades made for the C7's 2014 debut. Improved materials, more modern design, and significant new technology such as the Drive Mode Selector and latest-generation Chevy MyLink infotainment help bring the Corvette on par with European and Japanese offerings in the highly competitive, but relatively low-volume super sports car segment.

All Corvette trims get a fully-wrapped interior, where every surface is covered with premium, soft-touch materials. Available materials, depending on the trim level, include Napa leather, aluminum, carbon fiber, and micro-suede. Customers also have two seating choices: a regular GT seat and a Competition Sport seat with more aggressive side bolstering for greater support on the track.

Even during longer driving sessions, the Corvette's new GT seats are comfortable and supportive, despite the low-slung nature of the cabin. The available Competition Sport seats are extra-supportive, although they may not be to the liking of folks with all body types—a trial fitting is recommended before placing an order. Leg and head room are good even for those over six feet tall, and, as with the last Corvette, there's plenty of room for a weekend's travel in the rear hatch or the convertible's trunk.

Thanks to a well-designed aluminum body structure, the Stingray and Z06 convertibles avoid the dreaded cowl shake that often accompanies a coupe that's had its roof sawed off. These drop-top models manage to offer the same level of ride-and-handling prowess as their coupe counterparts since the C7 was designed as an open-top roadster from the start. And the automatic soft-top arrangement, which will operate at speeds of up to 30 mph, is tight-fitting and doesn't block too much visibility when it's up.

Neither the NHTSA nor the IIHS have crash-tested the Chevy Corvette in recent years, but a rigid chassis, a full complement of airbags, plus stability and traction control, and the Corvette's innate grip and handling should make it relatively secure in emergency situations.

For 2016, both Stingray and Z06 coupes and convertibles receive several feature enhancements, additional options, and available design packages to keep things fresh. New exterior colors include Corvette Racing Yellow and Long Beach Red Metallic, which replace Velocity Yellow and Crystal Red from the previous model year. The three design packages are the Spice Red, Twilight Blue, and Jet Black Suede, each with an interior in the hue denoted by their name along with many unique exterior details like painted trim,

stripes, wheels, and different top colors for convertibles. The latches on convertible trunks and coupe hatches all get a power-cinching feature to pull them down, steering wheels get a flat-bottom design, and a new front curb-view camera will be available. Chevy is also offering Magnetic Ride Control on Stingrays without the Z51 package and will include the Z51 wheels and rear spoiler on those cars. The Z06 will be offered in a limited-run C7.R Edition package, painted Corvette Racing Yellow and trimmed to resemble the brand's eponymous race cars; 500 will be built in a mix of coupes and convertibles.

The 2016 Corvette Stingray continues on with its solid-for-a-sports-car fuel economy, scoring 17 mpg city, 29 highway, 21 combined with the 7-speed manual; the paddle-shift 8-speed automatic is nearly as efficient, rated at 16/29/20 mpg according to GM. The Z06 is understandably less efficient, at 15/22/18 mpg with the stick, and 13/21/16 mpg with the 8-speed auto. Both transmissions have wide ratio spreads and tall top gears for greater highway mileage, and cylinder-deactivation technology also helps conserve fuel in low-load situations.


Recent Events:



Do you need an easy and delicious Easter Brunch recipe? This casserole is tasty and simple to put together.

Easter Breakfast Casserole

1 lb. bacon 8 eggs

 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup diced onion 2 cups milk

 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup diced green bell pepper 1 (16 oz) pkg frozen hash browns, thawed

3 cups shredded cheddar cheese

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Lightly grease 7x11 casserole dish

Fry bacon in large, deep skillet over medium heat until evenly browned, about 10 minutes

Drain on paper towels and crumble

In a large bowl, beat together eggs and milk

Mix in cheese, bacon, onion and green pepper

Stir in the thawed hash browns

Pour mixture into prepared casserole

Cover with aluminum foil and bake for 45 minutes

Remove foil and bake for another 30 minutes until the eggs have set



Corvette Racing – Jim Alvis

Corvette Racing and the No. 4 Corvette C7.R have widened their lead in the 2016 IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship's GTLM class after driving to victory in Saturday's Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring. The No. 4 car and drivers Tommy Milner, Oliver Gavin and Marcel Fassler launched into the GTLM championship lead in January after winning the 2016 24 Hours of Daytona.

The No. 3 C7.R, driven by Antonio Garcia, Jan Magnussen, and Mike Rockenfeller started Saturday's race from fifth on the grid while the No. 4 car was sixth. Both Corvettes began to struggle as a heavy downpour descended on the Sebring circuit and caused them to fall through the running order, however the pair was slowly able to recover and closed the gap to their GTLM rivals.

Garcia, Magnussen and Rockenfeller's day ended in the eighth hour of the race when the No. 911 Porsche 911 RSR of Kevin Estre locked up and crashed into the No. 3 C7.R as they entered Turn 1. Estre had tried to brake late on a damp surface on slicks and ended up overshooting the turn, sending Magnussen and him sliding into the outside tire barriers. The shunt ended Estre's day, while the No. 3 C7.R was relegated to the garage for about 90 minutes of repairs, and did finish the race.

The next race of the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship will be the Toyota Grand Prix of Long Beach on Saturday, April 16th.

If you've been looking for the perfect place to take a jog or walk, go on a bicycle ride with the family, or even inline skate, the NCM Motorsports Park is opening the track on Tuesday evenings starting March 15 for a new "Trek @ the Track" program. The 3.15 mile paved road course plays host to a number of fundraising running and walking events each year, including Monster Dash benefitting Joseph's Hope, and the Checkered Flag Chase benefitting the Alzheimer's Association.

Trek at the Track is free, and will be from 5 to 7 pm starting March 15 (weather pending). Please check the website at www.motorsportspark.org for a complete schedule and to verify times.

The track offers light elevation changes and a number of configurations so that visitors can pick the length of their trek, as well as being wide with adequate space for slow or fast-moving trekkers. A large 22 acre flat paved paddock is also available for anyone doing speed work. The facility offers restrooms, showers, a Michelin inflation station and a picnic area at the Kimberlee A. I grabbed my stuff, rushed out to the cab, lifted the lady's dress and began to take off her underwear.


Suddenly I noticed that there were several cabs - - - and I was in the wrong one.
